
SUBJECT: Establishment of a Department of Defense (DoD)/Intelligence Community (IC) Unified Cross Domain Management Office (CDMO)

As a result of urgent operational demands to share information more effectively across differing security domains throughout the federal government, effective immediately, we have established an interagency office, the Unified CDMO, that will focus on delivering modern cross domain capabilities to the field as soon as possible. The Director, National Security Agency (DIRNSA), in his capacity as the DoD Information Systems Security Program Manager and the GIG Information Assurance Architect, shall host the CDMO and provide the CDMO Director, who will also function as the on-site supervisor for all DoD personnel (including DoD IC personnel) assigned or detailed to support the CDMO. The Office of the Director of National Intelligence will provide the Deputy Director, who will serve as the on-site supervisor for all IC personnel assigned or detailed from outside DoD to support the CDMO. Other DoD and IC organizations shall also assign or detail key personnel to create a truly unified capability. (This does not create a new organization. The term office is used for administrative purposes. All resources will remain in the parent organization. Each agency will pay for its own participation. The evaluation, assignment, and supervision of personnel serving in the CDMO will remain with their parent organizations.) All DoD and IC cross domain efforts will fall under the jurisdiction of the CDMO.


CDMO primary functions will include: (1) developing a process for managing DoD and IC investments as they relate to cross domain solutions (CDS) and activities; (2) assisting the DoD and the IC in addressing cross domain functional needs based on approved and validated priorities; and (3) developing and managing a CDS roadmap identifying short, medium, and long term capabilities.

The CDMO shall deliver a proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to address the functioning of the CDMO and a CDS Program Management Plan to the ASD(NII)/DoD CIO and ADNI CIO for approval within 15 days of issuance of this memorandum.
